After listening to advice from local and national health care officials, our staff and deacons feel it is best to prevent possible spread of the coronavirus by postponing all church services, classes, concerts, and activities (with over 10 in attendance) until we are told that it is safe to resume our normal schedule.

1. Online Church Service.

Beginning this Sunday (March 22), we will have **one church service on Sunday mornings at 11 am** which will be carried live on our church facebook page and on radio station WCGW 770 AM and 93.3 FM. This service will be recorded and played on Spectrum channel 376 on Sundays at 2 pm, Thursdays at 8 pm, and Fridays at 9 am. DVD's of the service will also be available free on request by calling the church office (839-3415).

Since we are allowed to have only 10 people in attendance, the production of the online service will be limited to the ministry staff, musicians, singers and AV workers. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause to our members and hope this situation will only last a few weeks.

2. Prayer Requests.

3. Giving.
